

BBH Intermediate Municipal Bond Fund

Monthly Fund Update / October 2022

The BBH Intermediate Municipal Bond Fund Class I ("the Fund") returned -0.50% in October and the Bloomberg 1-15 Year Municipal Blend Index returned -0.38%.

Interest rates rose in October as market predictions for the pace of Federal Reserve (Fed) tightening continued to increase. Municipal fund flows continued to weigh on markets while market volatility remained elevated. Investors withdrew \$11.8 billion from municipal funds during the month.

Credit spreads continued to widen, and that weighed on the Fund's revenue bond holdings. However, these conditions also fueled opportunities for the Fund, which included housing bonds, airport bonds, and hospital bonds.

We remain focused on durable credits¹ that can control their own destinies and protect their market access. We believe this focus takes on increased importance as the Fed fights inflationary pressures and pushes the economy toward a possible recession. Owning these credits allows us to take advantage of opportunities generated by choppy markets.

¹ Obligations such as bonds, notes, loans, leases, and other forms of indebtedness, except for cash and cash equivalents, issued by obligors other than the U.S. Government and its agencies, totaled at the level of the ultimate obligor or guarantor of the Obligation.
