Monthly Fund Update / February 2020

The BBH Income Fund Class I (“the Fund”) returned 1.67% in February, and the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Index returned 1.80%.

Treasuries rates fell an average of 37 basis points¹ (bps) along the curve. Returns in excess of Treasuries (excess returns) for 3 to 5-year investment grade (IG) and high yield (HY) corporate bonds were -0.60% and -2.71%, respectively. For the month, total returns were 0.93% for 3-5-year IG corporates and -1.41% for HY corporates. The total return for floating rate loans was -1.35%. Asset-backed securities (ABS) and non-Agency commercial mortgage-backed securities (CMBS) returned 0.89% and 1.67%, respectively.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) supply chain disruptions, slowing global economic activity, and collapsing travel portend a near-term drop in U.S. economic growth. A recession is a distinct possibility. In the first week of March the yield on the 10-year Treasury bond fell below 1%. The Fed had cut rates 50 bps in an effort to bolster confidence and to cushion the economy against a downturn.

Spreads have widened, making valuations a bit more attractive, up from their recent place on the expensive end of their historical range. We are judiciously making purchases from the Treasury reserves that have been building over the past months but have not made any large portfolio changes.

The magnitude and duration of the effects of COVID-19 are unpredictable, but durable businesses and collateral should survive this downturn. Our long-term approach to investing will keep us focused on letting value opportunities drive portfolio construction, and we will invest in credit only when it meets both our long-term valuation² and credit criteria.

¹ A unit that is equal to 1/100th of 1% and is used to denote the change in a financial instrument.

² Our valuation framework is a purely quantitative screen for bonds that may offer excess return potential, primarily from mean-reversion in spreads. When the potential excess return is above a specific hurdle rate, we label them “Buys” (others are “Holds” or “Sells”). These ratings are category names, not recommendations, as the valuation framework includes no credit research, a vital second step.

Credit Quality letter ratings are provided by Standard and Poor's, Moody's and Fitch and are presented as the higher of the three ratings. When a security is not rated by Standard & Poor's, Moody's or Fitch, the highest credit ratings from DBRS and Kroll may be used. Credit ratings reflect the credit quality of the underlying issues in the portfolio and not of the portfolio itself. Issues with credit ratings of BBB or better are considered to be investment grade, with adequate capacity to meet financial commitments.
